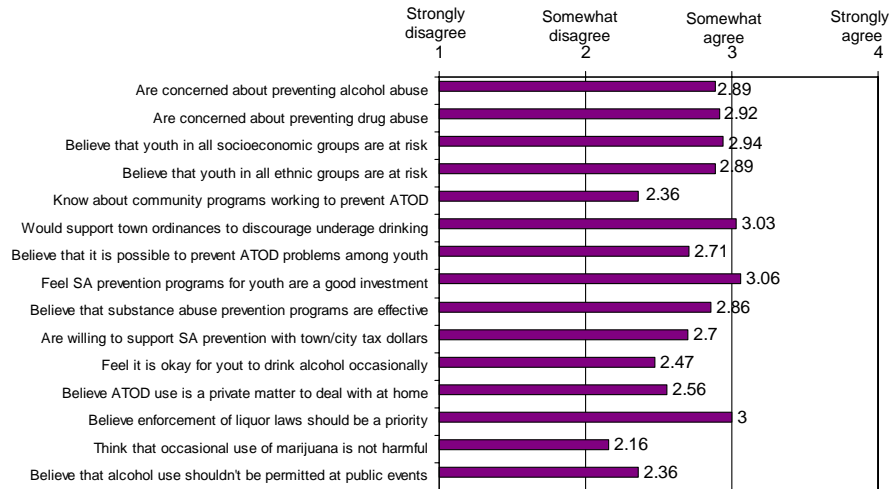
Key Informant Demographic Characteristics: Sub-Region 4-B, 2006





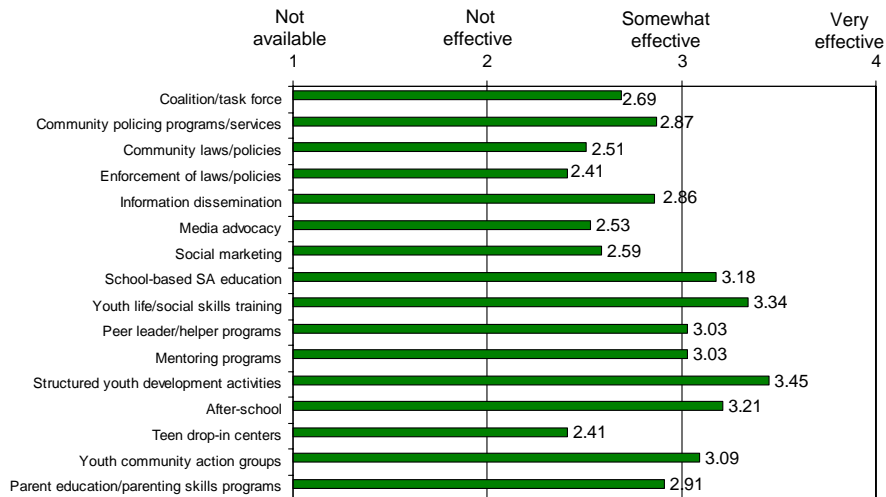

Key Informant Agreement that "Most" Community Residents:**



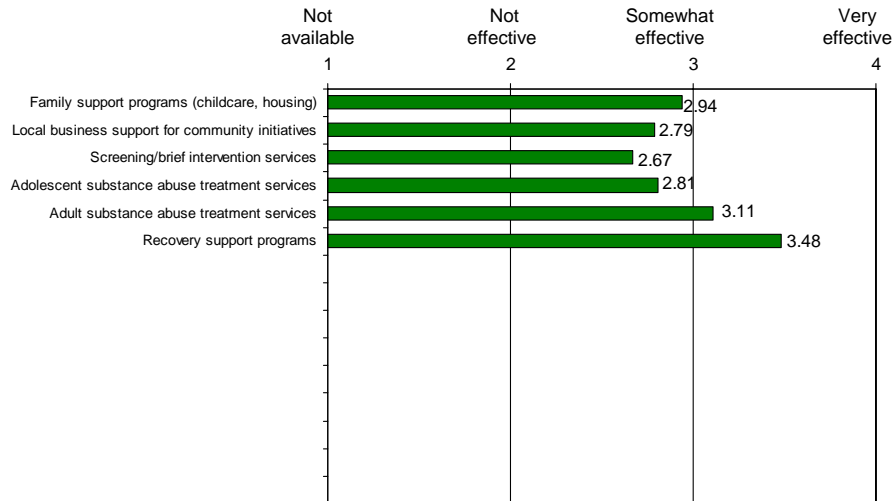

Sub-Region 4-B, 2006**



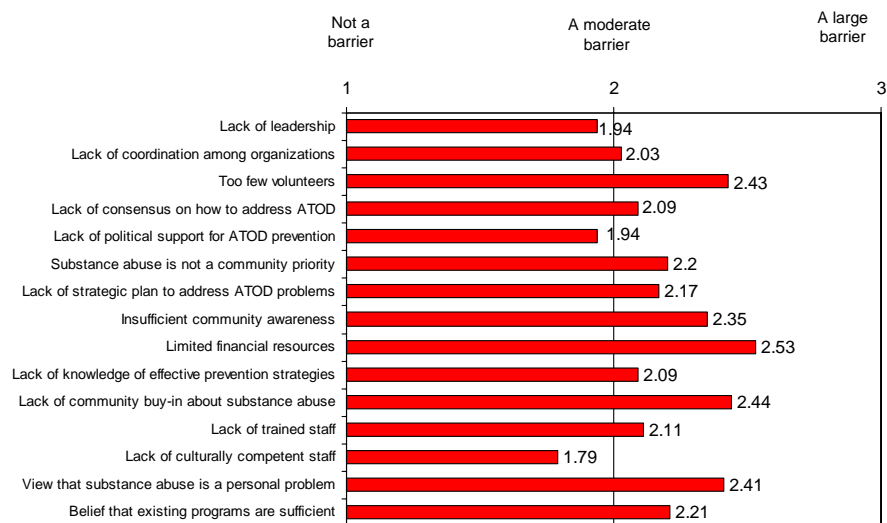

Key Informant Ratings of Substance Abuse Prevention Strategies in the Community: Sub-Region 4-B, 2006



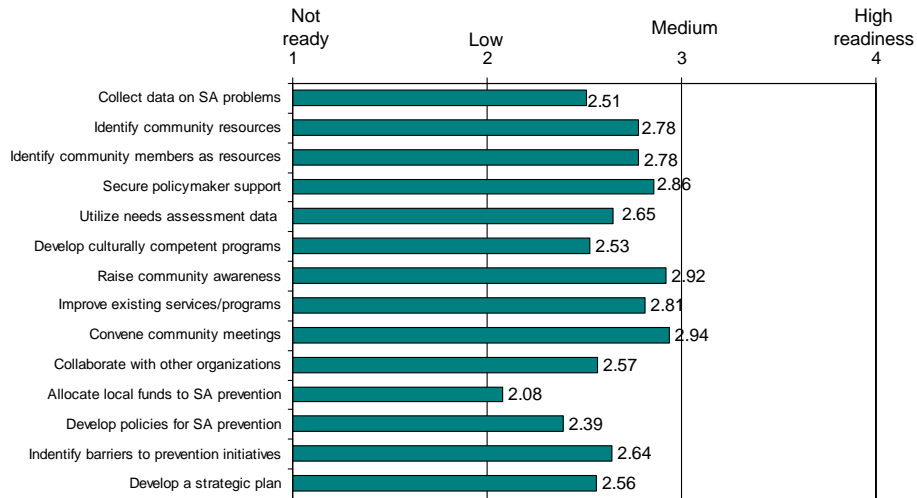

Key Informant Ratings of the Community Stage of Readiness for Substance Abuse Prevention: Connecticut, 2006

Community Stage of Readiness for Substance Abuse Prevention: Statewide	Percent (n=403)
1 – Tolerates or encourages substance abuse	2%
2 – Has little or no recognition of substance abuse problems	13%
3 – Believes a substance abuse problem exists, but awareness is only linked to one or two incidents involving substance abuse	19%
4 – Recognizes a substance abuse problem and leaders on the issue are identifiable, but little planning has been done to address problems and risk factors	27%
5 – Is planning for substance abuse prevention is focused on practical details, including seeking funds for prevention	19%
6 – Has enough information to justify a substance abuse prevention program and has great enthusiasm for the initiative	5%
7 – Has created policies and/or more than one substance abuse prevention program is running with financial support and trained staff	9%
8 – Views standard substance abuse programs as valuable, new programs are being developed for at-risk populations, and there is ongoing evaluation	4%
9 – Has detailed and sophisticated knowledge of prevalence, risk factors and program effectiveness, and programming is tailored by trained staff to address community risk factors	2%
